Quinta da Marinha

This large resort is on the outskirts of the well-heeled coastal town of Cascais, 40 minutes west of Lisbon. You can also get into Portugal's capital – a favourite with hipsters these days – on a train that edges along the coast to the city. The course here is pleasant with some cliff-edge holes but the biggest attraction is one of Portugal's biggest and best hotels and all its attendant amenities. Ideal for families as well as couples and groups – and for playing next-door Oitavos Dunes and Penha Longha.



Sporting Club

Berlin is of course a fabulous city to explore and this is the perfect base from which to do that while playing some Top 100-calibre golf. Located on the edge of Scharmutzelsee Lake, the city centre is an hour away. There are 63 holes here, by Nick Faldo and Arnold Palmer among others, The Faldo being a Continental Top 100 stalwart. The A-ROSA Scharmützelsee is a huge wellness resort with a vast array of high-calibre amenities.

Vidago Palace

FACT 1: Visiting Crecy in August gets you the best chance of playing Paris' private courses – Chantilly, Fontainebleau et al – that dominate our


that dominate our Top 100. The members are all on holiday then!

Bogogno

Fly to Malpensa airport west of Milan – bursting with fashion, food and football appeal – and you are just 25 minutes from Bogogno. Here, there are two very consistent 18-holers, by Robert von Hagge. They are built around a well-appointed hotel, which has a large pool, children's playground, tennis courts, a football pitch and fabulous terrace restaurant. A touch of class.



El Encin

There is a Robert von Hagge course here that has hosted the European Tour. As well as the classical Von Hagge baroque sculpting on the course there are sports facilities galore as well as a well-appointed 39-room hotel on site. All that makes it a slick base for a golf break to Spain's capital Madrid.



Crecy

Crecy has two Arnold Palmerdesigns on site – American-style courses that are much better than you might imagine – as well as charming accommodation within centuries-old, renovated buildings. The food is world class. Central Paris is 20 minutes away, Disneyland Paris is five minutes.

When we compiled our first – indeed the first anyone had put together – Top 100 ranking of the best golf resorts in Continental Europe last year, the geographical diversity did not surprise me. We are, I think, past the stage of our eyebrows being raised at the sight of a country other than Britain, Portugal or Spain having representation in Top 100 lists.

It did however surprise me a little that there were so many close to capital cities. When we ranked the best golf resorts in Britain and Ireland last year, there was a good



sprinkling in cities, notably on the outskirts of Dublin and London. Yet on the Continent, we tend to think of golf resorts as sitting on the Algarve or Costa del Sol etc. While nearby Faro and Malaga are of course sizeable cities, they are not country capitals. I've picked out six here, but there could have been many others. In Lisbon, there is also Aroeira to the south, Penha Longha and Oitavos in Cascais, and Praia D'El Rey, Bom Sucesso and Royal Obidos to the north. North of Barcelona - albeit closer to Girona – is the fabulous PGA Catalunya, and also the lowerprofile Barcelona Golf.

PGA National on the outskirts of Malmo and The Scandinavian half an hour from Copenhagen didn't make the list as they are golf-centric, thus losing marks for their lack of non-golf



amenities, but rest assured they are superb complexes with magnificent accommodation.

Royal Zoute is also of that ilk although it did make the list and is a wonderful base for a trip to easy-to-love Brussels. Estonian G&CC squeezed in and is well placed for a long weekend that you won't forget in Tallinn. And Paris has a second option with the next Ryder Cup venue Golf National having accommodation overlooking the 18th. It would be a great autumn option after the matches.
