

Costa Navarino receives Silver award at the WTM World Responsible Tourism Awards, recognising its sustainability efforts

Partnership with WWF Greece to combat single-use plastics

London, 8 November 2022 – <u>Costa Navarino</u> has been recognised for its continuous commitment to sustainable tourism development and was the recipient of a Silver Award at this year's **WTM World Responsible Tourism Awards**, in the 'Reducing Plastic Waste in the Environment' category. In 2021, Costa Navarino managed to reduce the use of single use plastics, compared to 2019 by 2.3 tonnes, whereas without counting Covid-related plastics, the use was reduced by approximately 5.7 tonnes.

Greece's prime sustainable destination has partnered with <u>WWF Greece</u>, with the aim to limit single-use plastics across its resorts and operations. Through joining forces, a full inventory report is carried out annually, measuring the amount of plastics used across the destination's distinct resort sites, with the objective to reduce these as much as possible.

Through this flagship programme, the aim is to significantly contribute to the reduction of plastic waste and plastic pollution ending up in the Greek seas, and to mobilize the immediate supply network, local communities as well as the wider hospitality industry in setting ambitious goals.

This partnership comes as a natural step, in line with Costa Navarino's participation at the **UN Global Tourism Plastics Initiative**, led by UNEP and UNWTO in collaboration with the Ellen MacArthur Foundation.

Another key target set by Costa Navarino is to achieve carbon neutrality for the GHG emissions resulting from the activities of the facilities by 2030, through -among others- direct emissions reduction and onsite energy production from renewables. Further key initiatives include the biggest olive tree transplant program in Europe, the creation of water reservoirs with a total capacity of 1,180,000m³ to cover irrigation needs only with surplus surface water, and the establishment of the Navarino Environmental Observatory (NEO) since 2009 together with Stockholm University and the Academy, a research and education hub on climate and environment in the Mediterranean region.

Earlier in 2022, Costa Navarino also won Best Sustainable Destination in the Marie Claire Sustainability Awards, adding to its list of environmental accolades.
